- **PLEASE PURCHASE PROFESSIONAL GRADE PAINTS.** Student grade paints create mud due to fillers and not pure pigment.
- These are just suggested colors that I use – I use mostly transparent.

WATERCOLOR BRUSHES I recommend Sable or Sable blend. Cheap Joe's Legends are good & Richeson

Rounds:

- #12 or #10
- #8

Flats:

Do NOT need to be Sable or Sable blend for flats

- ¼"
- ½"

Rigger or liner Brush (very long bristles)

Other brushes of your choice (Need to be soft and pliable)

PAPER

D'Arches 140lb Cold-press watercolor paper – 1 22 x 30 sheet D'Arches ONLY (**preferably not in pad form**)

OTHER SUPPLIES

- Any waterproof hard board will do, such as tile board, foam core, sealed plywood, Plexiglas. You might want several sizes 12x16
- Watercolor palette **with a lid** such as *John Pike Palette* (**Need to have palette large enough to mix your colors. At least 20 wells**)
- Water container (**PLEASE something larger than a butter dish**)
- Small spray bottle to keep paints moist
- 2 bulldog clips
- Old terrycloth towel & Kleenex
- Sponge- cellulose (To put in palette to keep paints moist)
- #2 drawing pencil
- Kneaded eraser
- Paper Towels
- Masking tape
- Tablet for making notes
